Exploring New Space

Shuffling, moving, organizing, finding the right spot, are all part of being in the NOV office these days. "Does anyone know where the three-hole punch is?" and "Where are we keeping the coffee now?" are frequent conversation openers as we make the transition to our new space.

The change, of course, began before the truck arrived on Saturday, June 28. Early in that week, **Linda Joslin** and a crew of packers sorted through what to take and what to discard. As they put things in boxes, labeling each one as to what was inside, they also made piles of things to be donated, with notes about where they should be taken.

That Saturday, **Bob Field** rented a 14' truck and led the team of **Larry Hannah**, **Joe Evinger**, **Franco Giunta** and his friends **Hadrian** and **John** plus **Bob Davidson**, that made the actual physical move of NOV's belongings.

It took two trips, loading and unloading the truck each time, to get everything from Rockridge Center to its *new space in the First Congregational Church building at 27th and Harrison*. The men were accompanied by **Patte Bishop** in her car, hauling small things that hadn't fit into the truck. Upon arrival at the new site, the same fellows arranged the furniture under **Linda Joslin**'s direction. **Judy Sorey** was also an important part of this crew, filling in wherever she saw a need.

The office remained closed for a week over the Independence Day holiday, giving the office workers a chance to fine-tune the space before returning to the 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, Monday through Friday, schedule.

Linda and her daily changing crew of office volunteers have been getting things organized ever since, each volunteer contributing her opinion about what should go where in the supply storage area. Super handyman Larry Hannah brought his tool kit and repaired some things that were damaged in the move. Charles Shen continues to be helpful, too, rearranging furniture that doesn't fit exactly where it had been set originally as we continue to experiment with placement.

Both Linda Joslin and Lynda Pike took responsibility for moving our nerve center, the computer, and physically set it up in it in its new spot. Transferring the telephone, however, has taken a lot of time, patience and many phone calls.

One of the biggest changes for NOV has been accommodation to a smaller space. Some furniture from the old office was donated to other organizations, the refrigerator was left behind, homes were found for most of the other pieces, but fitting what was left into the new place has been a well-met challenge. The tables have been arranged to form a generous working space that is also a comfortable place for several people to hold a meeting.

Instead of the postage stamp kitchen we had in Rockridge, our new space offers us access to a food prep area at least twenty times the size of what we left. Our potlucks, an important part of NOV tradition, will be held in the large open space adjacent to the office. And when meetings are held during office hours, visitors can be taken to the light-filled, garden-like atrium for a one-on-one conversation.

There are many differences between our new space and the old one, but we are doing a good job of adapting. If you haven't seen it yet, you're always welcome to *drop by during office hours*. Better yet, come to our grand **opening party on September 27th (3:00 to 5:00 PM),** or one of our potlucks. Watch this space for more information on those.
