Burning Man Exhibit Each year the week-long Burning Man event attracts over 70,000 people to Nevada's Black Rock Desert. Participants create and build Black Rock City, a temporary metropolis



where experimental art installations—some ritually burned to the ground are the centerpiece for innovators, makers, and a burgeoning artistic community. The Museum exhibition will illuminate the values of Burning Man through its guiding Ten Principles: Radical Inclusion, Gifting, Decommodification, Radical Self-reliance, Radical Self-expression, Communal Effort, Civic Responsibility, Leaving No Trace, Participation, and Immediacy.

Our Rotary volunteers are coming back for




another round of Helping Hands! If you have any tasks around the house or yard that you could use some help with, contact the office to sign-up and have the volunteers come out.
